

- 10 Yet it pleased the Lord to bruise him; he hath put him to grief: when thou shalt make his soul an offering for sin, he shall see his seed, he shall prolong his days, and the pleasure of the Lord shall prosper in his hand.
- 11 He shall see of the travail of his soul, and shall be satisfied: by his knowledge shall my righteous servant justify many; for he shall bear their iniquities.



The greatest rabbit hunter of all time was Jason Bryant, who



After a day of hunting, we would return to the house to clean the rabbits and prepare for a feast. We would fry the rabbits and then eat them with sweet chili sauce. We would also eat wild game deer

snack sticks, rabbit hearts, and chicken gizzards. We would also go to the Chinese buffet that Uncle Jason and I loved although my dad thought it smelled funky and almost puked looking at it. After the Chinese restaurant, we went to a gas station and my Jason got me hooked to drinking Monster energy drinks. I have many powerful rabbit hunting memories with my uncle that I cherish and that is important because he passed away in September 2021 in a trucking crash. Today in 2023 my dad and I have Uncle Jason's dogs, we still go rabbit hunting with them, and have fun in his honor as we remember Uncle Jason and all the great memories we made with him.

This winter, my "beagle family" lost a great guy. He was the father of one of my kennel partners, John Barnett. He was also a hunting buddy and friend. He is probably unknown to most in the beagle world, but he was a lifelong houndsman. For those that did not know Charles Barnett, you missed out on knowing a great guy. To put what he was like into perspective, I would like to share a couple of my favorite "Charles" stories.

About seven years ago, John, Charles, my nephew Brian and I went swamp rabbit hunting in the bottoms. This big block of wood was almost shaped like a large square. We parked on the northeast corner of those woods and started hunting. We had been covering some ground and following the pack for a couple of hours when we came out on the west side of the woods. I saw Charles easing out into the field, heading south (away from the truck). I asked John where Charles was going, and he responded that he wanted to get something out of the truck. Of course, I told John that his Dad was going in the wrong direction! He just shook his head and said that he had tried to tell him, but he wouldn't listen!

At this point, I yelled, "Hey, Charles...where are you heading?" He told me that wanted to get something out of the truck. I replied, "Well, that is going to be a long walk 'cause you're going in the wrong direction!" Charles whirled around and told me, "Boy, I have hunted all over this country,



following hounds, and I know where the truck is!"

I decided just to play dumb, so I suggested that he just humor me and hunt in the other direction with me, and when we went around the corner, he would probably be able to see the truck. He did some serious grumbling but agreed. Sure enough, when we went around the northwest side of the woods, there sat the trucks about half a mile away. Charles just said, "Well, Sir!" and then some more grumbling that I chose to ignore. Lol

About a month later, at Christmas, I gave Charles a present. It was an emergency whistle with a built-in compass! When he opened it he let out laugh that I will never forget. I told him that if he got lost again, he could use that compass. If that didn't work, he could just sit down and blow that whistle until John or I found him. He said, "Well, Sir, if I didn't love you so much, I would give you a thrashing!"

A couple of years later, Charles, John, and I went for a hunt on public land. When they jumped, the hounds had only been cast for a couple of moments. What followed was absolutely beautiful. Those five hounds locked down and put on a show. They pushed that rabbit for the creek bottoms, through the woods back and forth

for over thirty minutes. Charles and I were on an old service road, and John was out in the woods. Finally, we heard John open fire. He yelled that he had got it and it was a swamp rabbit! Now, we were not expecting anything but cottontails where we were hunting. When we got to John, we saw that it was a big cottontail but not a swamp rabbit. I looked over at Charles and asked how he produced such a lying offspring?! Without a smile or a moment's hesitation, he replied in his signature southern drawl,



"Well, sir, he got that from his momma's side of the pedigree!" then he added," If I want her to know I said that, I will tell her!" I just about busted a gut laughing. There was never a dull moment with those two!

I will miss him trying to buy, sell or swap guns with you every time you went hunting. I will miss all of the "Well Sir's". Yes, they are just silly stories, but to me, the stories summed up how Charles was perfect. He was fiercely independent, a little stubborn, but he could admit when he was wrong (at least sometimes). He could joke and take a joke, even if it meant laughing at himself. He was also secure enough to tell people when he cared about them. Wouldn't the world be such a better place if we were all a little more like that? You will be missed, old fellow. Thank you for the memories.



# THOUGHTS FOR JUNE

June is a great time to enjoy all the hard work you have put into your beagles and running area. This is the peak of the rabbit population. Running areas should be flush with rabbits of all age groups, and the game is easily found. The weather is still cool enough in the mornings and evenings to get in lots of running. Days are long, so there is time to enjoy after work. At the end of the month, you may even find some wild raspberries to snack on while in the field. For all of the great things June provides, we shouldn't think that this is the end of ensuring a good population of rabbits in our running area for the rest of the year. In some respects, it is one of the busiest times of year for managing our running areas.

One of my interesting chores this time of year is scouting for fawns that were dropped in my pen. The first few years we had the fence up, fawns were a real annoyance. Their mothers saw that lovely grass cover and decided it would be ideal for concealing their babies. Of course, having a fawn jump up in front of your hounds is an almost irresistible temptation. Even dogs with no interest in running deer have difficulty controlling their prey drive when a fawn explodes from cover at the end of the hound's nose. And in



my experience, those fawns left in your running pen aren't going anywhere for a couple of months until they can physically jump your four-foot fence.

I counted five fawns in my pen that first year of the fawn invasion. Three of them were perhaps a day old and easy to grab and put over the fence. Each stumbled into the woods and laid down and With most cases, mother doe was nearby and took charge. The fourth fawn was larger and more wary. I was able to herd it through a gate after chasing it this way and that way. The fifth fawn wouldn't be herded. He had become a master at hiding. I knew he was in the pen, but I just couldn't find him. One night I left the big gate open. The next morning, standing on the deck drinking coffee, I watched an old doe walk through the gate into the pen. She went directly to a predetermined spot and her fawn emerged. The doe turned around, fawn in tow, and walked out the gate. I ran down and locked the gate behind them. The numbers have varied over the years, but fawns were a real pain for several years.

The past two years, I haven't had any fawns in the pen. I have a

mowed path around the outside of my pen. I've delayed mowing it until late June. Perhaps not the perimeter path mowing provides enough suitable fawn cover for the deer not to come into the pen. I do find fawns hidden in the tall grass on the path when I mow later in June. So perhaps that simple fix of not mowing outside the pen early in the year paid off. On the other hand, there may be enough activity in the pen that the deer now know to drop their fawns elsewhere. With that thought, we try to be active in the pen during the last couple weeks of May and into June.

Rabbits will need salt. It's important for digestion and metabolic functions. I try to keep salt at all of my feeding stations. Generally, I buy a 50-pound block of white salt and break it into



pieces that I replace when needed. I feed the rabbits in my running pen year-round, and I believe the added nutrition is needed to sustain the high number of rabbits present there in June. Keeping paths and food plots mowed consumes a few hours each week. Mowing now keeps grass tender and prevents it from hardening off this month. June is a good time to get some herbicide on the fence line. Most of the vegetation that is going to challenge my clean fence is actively growing and susceptible to a good kill with glyphosate or 2,4D herbicide. It seems there are always groundhog holes under the fence to fill in.

When it comes to fence maintenance, there are several plants that vex me, but I think mare's tail is the worst. Standard herbicides just seem to make it sick for a few days and then it comes back with more vigor. It grows through the fence and along the fence apron where I can't get it by mowing. It spreads by producing bushels of feathery seeds that float away when ripe.



My neighbor farms soy beans here and he is constantly plagued with mares tail in his fields. Perhaps I will try a new herbicide in my fence-maintenance mix this year.

June is also a good time to be thinking of late summer, autumn, and winter challenges for your rabbit population. Challenges in late summer include providing sufficient, quality feed after the cool season grasses and forbs harden off. The cover that we desperately need in autumn and winter is growing now. If we're planting fall and winter crops, it pays to be planning and starting work in June. This is a good time to clear off and prep any areas that are to be planted for fall and winter crops. Much of the work we do in June will pay off later. The cover you grow now will have to sustain your rabbits the rest of the year.

This year I have several blocks of switchgrass and lespedeza that



are aging out. Those areas have been in switchgrass for 10 years now, and the last couple years the stands have been failing. The established clumps of grass are seeming to fade. At the same time, the blocks are being overrun with oriental bittersweet, Japanese honeysuckle, blackberry canes, black locust, stilt grass, crabgrass, and other unwanted vegetation. I could try to preserve them another

year by mowing them off and treating with 2,4D or Plateau or other selective herbicides, but I can see the end for these stands of switchgrass and it's time to



rejuvenate. The rejuvenation process consists of clearing the whole block by mowing, then killing all of the vegetation with glyphosate (Roundup) herbicide. I may wait a couple weeks or more to see if anything in the soil-seed bank sprouts, then kill the block again with another application of herbicide or simply by tilling it.

June is a good time to do this clearing as there is plenty of other cover across the rest of my pen. Let these areas sit open without any planting for the remainder of the growing season until next spring when I replace the cover plantings. Ideally, these cleared areas will be planted to winter wheat or rye in September and October. This still leaves bare areas through the summer.

These bare areas still hold the opportunity to improve conditions for rabbits. There is a "no action" strategy, allowing whatever is in the seed bank to sprout after herbicide application. Most of the growth will be annual plants like crabgrass and ragweed. These



sprouts provide plenty of nutrition and do well in July and August's hot, dry conditions. Simply mow them off in the fall or leave them stand until the following spring. Tilling these areas every few weeks keeps young growth sprouting from the seed bank and it exhausts the store of weed seeds in the seed bank. Using up the seed bank now helps keep weed competition at a minimum next spring when you plant switchgrass. Just be sure not to let these weeds go to seed or you will be replenishing the soil seed bank again and defeating your efforts to exhaust it.

I like to play with different plantings, so any bare spot is likely to get planted with something. In the past I've mentioned Sudex, a sorghum X Sudan grass hybrid. It grows quickly, loves the summer



heat, and provides plenty of cover in a short time. That cover will last until next spring as the stalks bend over. Early on it looks (and gets treated) just like corn. The tall growth shades out weeds that might cause you problems next spring. June is still early enough to get a good stand of oats established.



Planted in mid-June, the sprouts and foliage provide excellent browse for rabbits. By August, there should be green and drying seed heads. When it's time to plant winter wheat in September, the oats are generally all gone. I find that rabbits love oats in all growth stages, especially the type of cover oats provide. When available, I also like to plant buckwheat. Buckwheat is highly digestible, high in protein, and high in moisture. It grows quickly, but then fades out in about 60 days. Buckwheat is perfect for preparing plots prior to planting winter wheat or rye later in the early fall. A mix of oats and buckwheat always seems to be a hit.

This year I'm going to try a new planting. A stern eyebrow was raised when I showed my wife the five pound bag of my next experimental planting. No, Sunn



Hemp is a tropical zone plant from Asia/India. It is a legume (meaning it fixes nitrogen from the air). Sunn Hemp grows to five feet in a season and is promoted as a cover crop that adds nitrogen and organic matter to the soil. I'm interested to see how well it grows here, and even more interested to see if the rabbits eat it or use it for cover. We'll give a report in a future issue.

Twenty years ago, June was a cooler month. I remember well lying in the grass along the club lane, popping black raspberries in my mouth, listening to my pack run through the knee-high corn field.



When did I forget to relax like that? Be sure to enjoy the blessings of June this year.





# SECOND AUCTIONED RABBIT HUNT IN SUPPORT OF THE BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA

This summer, Tom DeBolt called me to request a favor. I would be willing to offer a rabbit hunt for the Boy Scouts of America Baltimore Council. He recognized and understood that I was going to stop offering rabbit hunting trips for auctions with various hunting and fishing organizations that I am a member of or associated with in the state of Maryland. These hunting trips have become extremely popular and have raised considerable amounts of funds for these organizations. These hunts are always fun-filled, and the hunters go back home to their family and friends, bragging about the outcome. However, as I get older, these trips are becoming more tiring. Tom is a friend and General Manager of Benelli USA, which is located nearby, and is a member of the Baltimore Council. I agreed to his request. Tom would serve as one of the hosts for the







hunting lands, and I would bring my dogs for the hunt.

The Boy Scouts Baltimore Council hold their annual fundraiser and clay competition at a resort a short drive away. This year the fundraiser was held on September 29, 2022, and about two hundred guests attended. As part of the fundraiser, there were raffles, a silent auction, and live auction items as part of the fundraiser. Benelli USA donated some shotguns, and corporations also numerous donated items for hunting and outdoorsman. Included were hunting trips offered up for auction. As a charity auctioneer, I auctioned off the first three items. and another auctioneer, an Eagle Scout, auctioned the remaining items. I explained the particulars about the rabbit hunt, and the bidding took off like wildfire. Two bidders got into a bidding war, neither willing to give in to the other. When the bidding was over, the second or backup-bidder still wanted to go on a rabbit hunt and agreed to donate the same amount as the winning bidder for a second hunt. I had only agreed to one hunt, but this is a great

organization and a nice group of people, so I agreed to conduct a second hunt. The winning bidders would bring their shooting team, which consisted of four members, to the hunt. The auctioning of this item was the highlight of the day, with two groups of shooters going home happy that their team won the bid plus, we raised a nice piece of money for the Scouts program, making a way for many young people to participate in the scouting activities throughout the year.

Our winners of one of the hunting trips were Jim and Julie Smith. They chose February 13, 2023, as the best day for them and their team. This day was acceptable for us to use the Scouts organization property where we would be hunting. The hunt took place on the Broad Creek Boy Scouts Reservation in Harford County, Maryland. This property covers over 1700 acres located on rolling landscapes that house many wooded areas intermixed with trees, patches of briars, some weed-filled areas, and numerous ponds and lakes.



My friend and frequent hunting partner Chester Boggs I arrived at the Scouts main building around 8 am to meet our hunting team. After we exchanged pleasantries, I explained how the hunt would proceed and discussed safety first for hunters and the dogs. I told them that Chester and I wanted them to do most of the shooting, but we would pick up the slack if they missed a bunch of shots. Chester and I would try to keep them in position when a rabbit was up and running and returning, so they could better understand the hunt and better participate. A few questions were asked since this was most of their first rabbit hunting except for Tom, who has hunted with us for the last few years. The weather was perfect for rabbit hunting, with temperatures hovering around 35 degrees and sunshine, and would rise a bit as the day went on.

Our hunting party consisted of Jim and Julie Smith, John Elligson, David Pitts, Tom DeBolt, Chester Boggs, and I. Kenn Miller, CEO of this Council, and Jeff Lewis, Director of Development, accompanied us earlier into the hunt but did not carry guns and stayed back from the action. After everyone had put on their hunting attire and loaded up with shells, we rode to an area that was thick with briars. I released the dogs for the hunt. They were ready to rock and roll because they had been in the dog box for the two-hour ride, and now, they got to do what they lived for: hunt and chase rabbits. My team of dogs changed a bit over the last two years, with four new dogs to replace some dogs due to old age and one death. We

would be hunting with Buckshot and Sam, the last and oldest of my former team, Sammie, Shorty, Ransom, and Jim. Sammie, Shorty, and Ransom, my recent acquisitions from my friend Bo Achord in Louisiana. Bo breeds and raises his own stock and is kind enough to have sold me three good dogs. Sammie, Shorty, Ransom, and Jim are between 40 and 30 months old and are performing well. Sammie is a hot one and maybe the lead dog soon. Our hunt started in an area with lots of thick patches of briars. The dogs searched these briars hard and intensely but produced no rabbits. After much searching by hunters and dogs and locating no rabbits, our hosts said we would travel about twenty miles to a private club that some of them are members of. The clubhouse

is situated on a beautiful area of property with the house sitting in the middle with woods and fields surrounding it. Our hosts described an area we should hunt in because he sees rabbits when walking around the property. We searched the wooded areas that are bordered by thick briars but still produced no rabbits. After a short walk across the cut corn fields, I decided to have the dogs check out a briar-filled grassy area with a small stream running through it. Within minutes I saw a large rabbit dash away and headed into a weed filled area bordered by a small, wooded area. The dogs got on this rabbit scent quickly and we had our first chase going. This rabbit ran to the far corners of the property before it made a circle to return. I told Chester and Tom who were near me that

I was going to check on the pack to make sure they did not cross a small country road at the far end of the property. I walked quietly through the woods and could see the dogs working the scent line and they were now coming back towards the point of origination. I stood quietly and saw this fastmoving rabbit running directly toward me. I froze and let it run at full speed about ten feet from me. I yelled to the hunters that it was coming back. The dogs were hot on this scent line and ran it into the weed filled area. After much chasing, David made one shot at this rabbit as it ran on the outside of the weeds for our first rabbit. The dogs did not come to the end of the scent line as they normally do but jumped a second rabbit in the process and gave chase on it. David said he saw a second rabbit

dash away near him. I yelled a second rabbit up to the hunters. The dogs were hot on this rabbit making a circle within the weed field. This rabbit came out near me and was heading into the nearby woods where no one was standing so I put one shot on it for our second rabbit. Along with the dogs we searched the weed field for another rabbit, but none was found.

David and Jim said we should walk over a rise to a bottom area that is covered with briars, grass and old logs and rabbits should be there. Jim jokingly said if we don't get a rabbit in this spot, he would give me \$ 100.00. As soon as the dogs entered this section of covers, they hit a hot scent and Chester saw a rabbit move out. The dogs were pushing this rabbit hard. It made a circle with Chester making one shot for a miss. This rabbit returned near the three of us. I saw it twice but wanted the other hunters to shoot. This rabbit ran around the covers and across a water-filled area and lost the dogs. David saw a second rabbit run a distance away from us. I told the hunters to let the dogs work the covers and we will locate these rabbits. A short distance away the dogs picked up

a scent and gave chase to one of the previous rabbits. This rabbit ran near Tom who made one shot for a miss and yelled to me that it was coming my way. I saw it coming through the covers and stood still for a moment and made one shot for rabbit number three. We continued our hunt heading towards the house and trucks. As I was walking near a log covered with briars, I almost stepped on a rabbit. I yelled rabbit up and the dogs were ready to rock and roll again and hit the scent line quickly. This rabbit was moving quickly as it ran near Tom who put three quick shots on this fast-moving rabbit for misses. The dogs stayed true to this scent and continued chasing it. Julie saw it come out of the covers, trying to return to the point where it jumped. She yelled to Chester, "there it is" and

he made two shots with his sideby-side 20 gauge for a miss. The dogs were a short distance away and followed the scent line to a hole near a downed tree. This rabbit was stung by either Tom or Chester, making it take refuge in a hole. The dogs tried to dig it out, but to no avail. 



#### THE TRUTH ABOUT THE SKULLFORK AND BLACK CREEK BLOODLINES

#### THE MILE BRANCH SAMMY ERA

PART 17

Before I get into this month's story, I'd like to take a minute to give a shout-out to one of the all-time greats in the beagle world, Mr. Mel Stewart. I received a phone call from Mr. Mel yesterday. As always, hearing his voice on the other end of the line was good. He was calling to compliment me on the Skullfork/Black Creek articles. And coming from him, it was a great honor and humbling to hear him say, "Troy you're doing a great job, thank you for your honesty and accuracy in documenting

beagle history." Although Mr. Mel played no direct role in developing or breeding any of the Skullfork/Black Creek hounds, he did witness firsthand the history of this bloodline as it unfolded over a thirty-year span. He ran with Southfork JoJo and many of his offspring, then watched as outcrosses were added. He saw firsthand the results of outcrossed Skullfork/Black Creek hounds as they took over the SPO field trials in the south during the 1980s and '90s. Thank you, Mr. Mel, for a lifetime of dedication to the sport of beagling.

While looking back at these old hounds has been rewarding and brought back many fond memories, it has also been challenging to gather accurate statistics. Although I have lots of firsthand knowledge of these hounds, I don't remember all the details, such as field trial records and awards, so I have to rely on their owners and other sources. Many of the owners of these hounds live near the gulf coast and were hit hard by Hurricane Katrina in 2005; therefore, lots of the old records and photographs were destroyed by this horrific storm. That being said, I'm grateful to each

June 2023 Hounds & Hunting individual who furnished info and records for this series. However, I know we have failed to obtain 100% of the information due to circumstances, but hopefully, we have done justice to these hounds' roles in beagle history.

Mile Branch Sammy produced well with several different bloodlines, but like any other stud dog, some were better than others. When he was crossed back on Skullfork/ Black Creek bred females is when the magic really happened. If you recall, Sammy was 1/4 Skullfork/ Black Creek himself, so when he was crossed back on females from that line, the offspring were line bred with an outcross. Sammy's popularity and success brought much recognition to the Skullfork/ Black Creek bloodline, as many folks refer to him and his offspring as Skullfork or Black Creek. Most of the traits that he was famous for did not come from the Black Creek side of the pedigree but rather his dam Mile Branch Sadie. Let's give credit where credit is due. The infusion of hare and Blue Cap blood from Sammy's dam's side into this already great line of hounds gave them a muchneeded facelift, such as improved conformation, stamina, search, and brains.

In part two of this series, we talked about the first few crosses made on Sammy, and they all had something in common, the dams were closely related to Sammy's sire Black Creek Sam VI. This had not gone unnoticed as many local beaglers observed the success of these first crosses. In an attempt to duplicate this success, many breeders began to seek out Sammy

to cross on females with pedigrees similar to those initial matings.

Rannie Ladner was an up-andcoming young beagler at this time and was one of the first to take notice of the success of Sammy's offspring. Rannie had lots of experience with breeding and training racehorses and has been a karate instructor most of his adult life, and he knows a thing or two about conditioning the mind and body, whether it be man or beast. So, when he applied all this knowledge to beagles, it was an almost immediate success. He recognized the quality of Sammy's offspring and understood that he didn't need to reinvent the wheel but rather duplicate that which was already proven. He had seen Mile Branch Pistol Pete run and knew this was the direction he wanted to go with his breeding

program. I sold him a half-brother to Pete, a beautiful chocolate male named T-Bone out of Sammy and Horny Chop. T-Bone himself was on his way to greatness but met an untimely death at the hands of a pit bull. Rannie bred a female named Reinikes Katy to Pistol Pete, and that cross produced a good little female named IR'S Little Princess. Princess was later bred to a son of Sammy named FC JR'S Preacher. That cross produced another field champion, FC JR'S Little Preacher, who was a great little hound and producer. Rannie was like a whirlwind gathering up females to breed to Sammy in an effort to obtain as much of that blood as possible. He had the foresight that this line of hounds was destined for success coupled with a good understanding of how to breed, train and condition hounds. In

addition to all this, Rannie had an eye for a dog, a rare gift to recognize talent in young pups and then be able to develop it. He proved to be one of his era's most successful breeders and trailers. If he showed up at a field trial, you could be assured he didn't come just to socialize. He was going to have hounds with the ability to win and you could count on them being in top condition.

As mentioned in part two of this series, Rannie bought two male pups off of Sammy and Horny Chop. Both of these males became field champions, they were FC JR's T-Boy and FC JR's T.J. I started these two pups for Rannie, it was clear from the very beginning that they possessed the same great qualities of previous Sammy offspring like Mile Branch Pistol Pete.

T-Boy was a big bold beautiful chocolate colored hound that became an immediate sensation at spo trials in the south and he finished quickly. He could lock onto a line and hold it relentlessly with speed and accuracy, a true Mile Branch Sammy trademark. He was an absolute pleasure to watch run and was a gun hunters dream. When T-Boy and T.J. were in their prime Glynn Windham had an outstanding pair of young males named Glynn's Little Willie and Ben's Creek Sparky. They were littermates out of Glynn's Smooth On Simon and The Texas Molly bred by Mr. Willis Adams. Willie and Sparky were the real deal, and Glynn knew it would take a great hound to beat them. He had heard all the talk about T-Boy and T.J. so he invited Rannie Ladner to bring them over to run with him





to see for himself. Rannie eagerly accepted the invitation as he loved showing off his hounds. Now Glynn was highly respected and admired as a truly great hound man and to impress him or even get his approval on a hound was an honor. The short version of this story is, Glynn said, "T-Boy and T.J. ran a rabbit with more speed and accuracy than I have ever seen. Willie and Sparky were just hanging on for dear life. I have never been so glad to get my dogs back in the truck." Glynn, like most everybody that saw them run, had a new respect for this great pair of hounds and the producing ability of their sire Mile Branch Sammy. T-Boy was a great producer; he produced several field champions and a lot of rabbit dogs that were never entered in field trials.

T.J. was not near as bold as T-Boy as a matter of fact, he was a little kennel shy. Nor did he have as much drive; therefore, Rannie did not field-trial him as much as T-Boy. But like his brother and most of the Sammy offspring, he could explode off a check with precision-like accuracy. This combination is another trait that set the Sammy dogs apart from many hounds in those days, and that's why they were in the winner's circle more times than not. T.J. was sold to Dickie Beyl who trialed and finished him. T.I. had a remarkable field trial record. After Dickie bought him, he was entered in 37 trials, winning 21 of them, placing 2nd in nine, 3rd in two and 4th in two, that's placing in 34 out of 37 trials. Great record any way you slice it. In addition to that he won the Deep South Sire of the Year award five years in a row

(1993-1998), received the Better Beagling Sire of the Year award in 1994 & 1995 and produced 15 field champions along the way. T.J. like many of his half brothers, inherited an outstanding reproducing ability from his sire Mile Branch Sammy.

Rannie bought a female named Wanda's Golden Pearl specifically to breed to Mile Branch Sammy. From that cross came three notable hounds FC JR's Preacher, FC Tommy's Talking Deacon and Tommy's Talking Sammy. Rannie gave Tommy Moffett those three as weanling pups with the understanding that once they were started, he would pick one and Tommy would keep the other two.

Rannie chose Preacher a big chocolate colored hound who Rannie says is his all-time favorite beagle. Preacher was a big stout hound, tough as pig iron, ran with tremendous power but possessed amazing control. He also produced several field champions and whole lot of rabbit dogs that were never entered in a trial.

While Rannie was enjoying tons of success with his Sammy bred hounds Tommy Moffett was beginning to make some noise of his own with Tommy's Talking Deacon and Tommy's Talking Sammy. Sammy was one of those early bloomers that was almost unbeatable at a very young age but got a little too aggressive for SPO trials as he got older. He had at least one licensed win and I think he won the Deep South championship once, but Tommy eventually sold him to a gun hunter.

Deacon was a force to be reckoned with in SPO trials, he won the Deep South championship three years in a row. Hall of Fame member Wayne Martin says that Deacon is the best dog he has ever seen run a rabbit. He went on to become a great producer like his sire Mile Branch Sammy, producing several field champions himself.

I'm sorry I couldn't come up with a complete list of field champions that these sons of Sammy produced, but here's what I know; these dogs had a staggering impact on the SPO gundog movement in their day. They provided what many field trailers and rabbit hunters were searching for, the combination of search, desire, stamina, conformation and brains coupled with tremendous line control. I don't say they were in a class by themselves, but it didn't take long to call the roll.

I don't want to leave out the Sammy daughters. Although none of his daughters finished as field champions, several of them left a mark of their own as producers. To name a few, Windy Pines Sadie produced a FC Dogwood Tank; Pine Crest Bess produced Pon Run A Train and Pon Run Teddy from different sires and Mile Branch Dottie produced FC Burch's Creek Jazzy Julie. These are hounds that have had a long-lasting effect on the gundog beagle and can still be seen back in pedigrees on many of today's hounds.

Mile Branch Sammy had become a household name among beaglers in the south by the late 1980's. Although many females had been bred to Sammy and he was considered one of the top sires in the country, very few people ever saw him run. Heck Roy protected him like he was a national treasure. No seriously, Sammy was treated for heart worms and Roy was cautious about running him, but I do have to say Roy is a little on the peculiar side though. I'm proud to say I am one of the very few who saw him run. Sammy was in the top five of Better Beagling's Top Sires List three years in a row. He was inducted into the Confederate Beagle Association Hall of Fame in 1990 and inducted into the Great Southern Beagle Hall of Fame in 2010. He produced five field champions, many other field winners and countless rabbit dogs that were never entered in a field trial. During a period when folks were searching for the total package in a beagle, his offspring set a standard that many folks compare hounds to even today.

Through these offspring Sammy left a legacy as one of the greatest sires of gundog beagles of all time. Not too shabby for a dog who was never entered in a field trial nor advertised at stud or promoted in any way other than word of mouth.

Throughout these articles I've mentioned Roy McCain owner and breeder of Mile Branch Sammy. I can't emphasize enough the importance of the role he has played in beagle history, had it not been for him this entire chapter would be missing. Roy is a charter member of Great Southern Beagle Club and was recently inducted into our club's Hall of Fame. He's still active in the club as well as beagling. If any of you ever have a chance to sit and talk dogs with Roy, I promise you will enjoy his vast hound knowledge. If you see him and don't have time to visit, at least take time to shake his hand and thank him for his great contribution to beagling.

In closing let me say, it's been extremely enjoyable putting these articles together. In trying to capture 30 plus years of history in just three short articles I realize I may have left out some important details or individuals. But let me assure you, it certainly wasn't intentional. Thanks for the many calls, emails and private messages. It's very encouraging to know folks are enjoying the articles. I'm just a common man with no formal training as a writer. Next month we'll discuss another great son of Mile Branch Sammy, FC Gator Creek Pistol Pete and his remarkable owner Bryan Raby. Thanks for reading and God bless.

#### Style vs. Accomplishment the Old Debate

I want to start this little rambling about the title. I have been a houndsman most of my life. I am 61 years old; I have had beagles since I can remember. I got into coonhounds too, but I always had beagles. Now the type of beagles I ran then was the SPO type, I didn't trial them, but they were decent gundogs. They ran rabbits fast, and the work was rough and sometimes sloppy, but they brought the rabbits around, and you did get shots. Although, I must add they lost their share of rabbits too.

Now to the present, when my pair of SPO hounds got too old to hunt, I was on the lookout for a new pair of beagles. I contacted my very good friends Fred and Karen Eurick; Fred is an icon for Traditional Brace Beagles and is in the Hall of Fame. Fred told me to investigate a beagle format called Appalachian Gundog Brace.

As I did research into this running format, I liked what I was reading and seeing on videos. Fred helped me by getting in touch with the guys he knows who run these hounds. I contacted Ron Barlow and made arrangements to see his hounds run; impressive, to say the least. These hounds ran with the line right between their legs; when the rabbit turned, they were right there, close, neat, tight check work and good loud mouths.

The other good quality was they didn't push the rabbit to another zip code, and they moved it fast enough to keep the rabbit in his home territory and more than enough opportunities to get shots; checks were almost none. I was very lucky to connect with Greg Brandt, who happened to have two male AGBF beagles for sale, so you all know these hounds are at a new address. I only wish I had known of this style of beagle earlier.



### OL DAWG LEARNS NEW TRICK

I sat on our back deck, resting my tired bones and aching muscles and watched as Amy tried in vain to teach her old cat how to retrieve a toy mouse.

"Hun, it aint gonna happen. That ol cat is set in her ways. She has no interest in trying to learn new tricks".

"Stop bossin me, " she snapped. Standard response.

The aches were a result of another judging assignment. Thirty years ago I could judge a field trial and be ready to do it again in two days. Not anymore.

My phone began to hum and a quick glance revealed that Tony Barlow from York and Adams Beagle CLub was on the line. I met Tony a few years ago and discovered that he is refreshingly kind and pleasant.

"Would you judge a 2 couple pack event here in March?" he asked.

" I'm an SPO judge, Tony. I've never judged one of those events in my life".

"We can put you with someone who has done a few of them," he continued. I told him that I was flattered that he called but I was probably too old to start judging a new format.

Tony continued, "It is not that difficult to learn". I could see what York and Adams was up to: Have the nicest member of the club call for judges. "Who could turn Tony down?" they figured.

"Okay. I will do it".

The Two Couple Pack Hunt Test is the latest format to be introduced into AKC beagle events. growing in popularity. In actuality, the Two Couple Pack format has been run as a sanctioned event for years but AKC began licensing events in 2006. What is unique about the 2CP is that hounds don't compete in head to head competition. Each participant shows up with four registered hounds and enters them as a pack. Friends can combine their hounds to form a pack. Packs compete against each other and clocks are used to determine their ability to stay on the rabbit.

As the date of the event grew nearer, anxiety crept into my feeble brain. I knew there was no way to back out so I spoke to others who had judged these events. I ferreted through the AKC rule book regarding procedures. Still, there was trepidation. After having judged over 200 SPO and GDB trials, this would be a totally different experience.

To ease my apprehension, York and Adams chose for me the perfect partner: veteran judge Mr Keith Collins. I had long respected his judging and even got the chance to hunt hare with him a couple of times. Keith is knowledgeable,

patient and a fine communicator; all the qualities a good judge needs. More importantly, he was experienced in 2CP. My blood pressure eased.


On the morning of the event, twenty packs of hounds were entered. That seemed overwhelming but Keith eased my tumult with, "We'll be okay". The club had an adequate supply of rabbits and helpers in the field. I just needed to remember that this was not an SPO trial.

I'm sure Keith delighted in watching me chase after the first couple of packs, making note of individual accomplishments and faults of each hound as the packs scurried after rabbits. I ran back to meet Keith who was enjoying the Spring day to discuss the pack. "You tired out yet? Ya know, you don't have to chase after em" he said as others nearby snickered.

"Oh I know" I replied, but truthfully I had forgotten. In 2CP, judges stay within sight but need not evaluate each hound.

Here is an explanation from Jim Odle of AKC:

"All hounds must be cast and scored on searching ability and tested for gun shyness. The packs are normally given 20 minutes of running time. But in events where there is a large entry the event committee may change run time to 15 minutes. The packs are timed on the run time clock. In addition to the run clock there is a credit time clock. This clock is used to credit the hounds when at least three of the four hounds





are tonguing and making forward progress on the line".


The purpose is to find the pack that is the most useful as a hunting pack of beagles. Thus they need to work together and decisively. As judges we are looking for the pack that makes the most forward uninterrupted progress on the scent line with the least amount of "down time".

This was a real education for this old dog. I was fascinated to watch the different packs and how they worked together. Speed is relevant. Some packs were quicker than others but the beauty of the 2CP is that handlers created their own packs of hounds and needn't worry about other dogs. I learned that "run time" was imperative to

success. As a handler, you wanted that pack running that rabbit. When there was a breakdown and silence, the clock paused. Thus the pack with fewer losses or breakdowns was more successful. The use of the clocks took some effort but the help of a good marshal made it easier.

By day's end I had witnessed several packs of hounds that I wish I could hunt with. One pack earned the blue ribbon but all that earned places were impressive.

While this new format continues to grow in popularity, it may not be for everyone but it does create a playing field for the rabbit hunter and his favorite pack of hunting beagles to participate in AKC competition.



And as much as I hate to admit it, Amy's old cat did eventually fetch the cat toy, much to her delight.

#### Handler Rules

- Open to handlers ages 7 to 17 who submitted Junior Handler Enrollment form to UKC. Forms available online.
- Handlers compete in two age divisions. 12 and under in Junior Division. 13 to 17 in Senior Division.
- Maximum of 3 dogs per class may be handled by each handler. Handler may only run in one class that is being run at the same time.
- Handler must enter dogs being handled; answer at roll call; initial and subsequent calls in series; in-field calls; and physical handling of the dogs during the judging process.
- Handler's Name must be included on the Official Junior Handler Points Form for points to be issued. Points forms MUST be completed by handler and submitted to the club's Master of Hounds on the day of the trial.
- Junior Handler points may only be acquired through UKC Licensed Gundog Trials.
- 7. All rules of the UKC and the BGA will be enforced during trials.

- 1. One point will be given for each dog handled.
- One point will be given for each dog owned by Junior Handler.Points will be given for each dog placing in the field (as follows):





### The Gay Hound Beginnings

The Story Of Frank Reese and Gay Kennels By: Rev. John Parks

Last month we were talking about the cross of Gay Nell to Fd. Ch. Wilson's Timmy II, and something new that happened that had never occurred before in the Gay hounds.

Well a cross of Wilcliffe Boogie was brought into the line. That is somewhat surprising, because Frank Reese had not talked favorably about the "Boogie hounds" to me. He classified them as "walkie talkies," of which he did not approve. He also felt that some descendants of Car-E-Line Buddy fell into the "walkie talkie" category too. You may have noticed that another cross of Car-E-Line Buddy was brought in by Fd.Ch Wilson's Timmy II also there had been a previous cross of Car-E-Line Buddy in Gay Baker's pedigree through Fd Ch William's Pointline Buddy too. However Reese thought a lot of Fd Ch Wilson's Timmy II as an individual hound. He liked the way he ran and besides that, Timmy had terrific conformation, so evidently Reese went ahead and made the cross for those reasons. Reese later indicated that Timmy was almost too heavily built for him. Reese said "Had I seen Timmy before I bred I would not have used him. Gay Cindy and Gay Hasty were both top bitches, far above the best average and a number of top breeders tried to buy them as soon as they started. Hasty was bred to Williams' Pointline Buddy and I did not get a good one in the litter. Hasty was also bred to Bag Pipe and the pups were worthless. Hasty could walk a rabbit down a hardtop road and tongue it all the way. Cindy was booked to Pearson Creek Casanova due to a great winner by him on a Wilson's Timmy bitch, but ]im Exuni (of Happy lack) talked me out of that. Cindy, Baker and Charm (Patterson's Little King x Gay Slide) made up the

best trio I ever saw run. Also, we braced Cindy with Wilson's Timmy II and recorded it. I never saw a better brace run. Cindy came in heat and with no (other) plans I sent her to Pointline Buddy in spite of the cross on Hasty. Fury had had two great litters by Buddy. Gay Dash came in this litter, the only male. He was named for Mr. Dash the Watergate lawyer. The bitches in the litter were no good. I kept Dash until he was five years old, gave him away twice, and each time got him back. I never bred a bitch to him. Finally, I let Donald Crider see him run in brace with Gay Baker and sold Dash... (to Crider)".

Reese declined to discuss Gay Dash any further than the above with me. Dash had above average conformation, somewhat like Fd. Ch. Wilson's Timmy II, and he attracted a lot of attention just by his good looks. After purchasing Gay Dash, Donald Crider advertised him rather extensively at stud to the general beagling public. In fact most of the Gay Dash ads were full page size with 800 or more words in them. There are a number of gundog breeders that have descendants of Gay Dash in their kennels today. Gay Dash has probably improved conformation in his descendants, however it is obvious from his silence, that even though he bred Dash, Frank Reese was not really enthusiastic about him at all.

Frank Reese said Cindy came in heat again and he thought there would be no good anyway so I will try her on Gay Baker, a young hound then that had never been bred. Gay Flag, Gay Flash, and some other good ones came from this litter Frank said "it is the only cross I ever made that I wanted more of exactly like them. Frank made this cross eight times

hounds resulting were good type, but not the best; but in the field an answer to everything that I could ask. I believe the first litter were probably better than any of the later litters." After Reese said this, I asked myself lust what made this cross different from the first cross of Gay Cindy to Fd. Ch. Williams' Pointline Buddy, and the only genetic difference that I could detect is the inclusion of Gay Fury (Gay Baker's dam) in the pedigree to make the female lines on both the sire and dam's side Gay hounds, instead of just on one side as with the Gay Cindy x Pointline Buddy cross. Take a look at the pedigree of the Cindy x Baker cross and you will see what I mean:

See, there's old Gay Slide there twice, and also the influence of Gay Baker comes into play too. Let's look at some of the hounds this cross produced. The first that Frank Reese mentioned was Gay Flag. I have seen pictures of Flag and he has an almost identical body to Baker's, but it seems (from the pictures) as though he may have had an even smaller head and muzzle. Frank Reese said "I consider Flag to be the best sire of my experience". Too many of the top winners go back to him to list. Flag was bred to Fd. Ch. Muennink's Betty and three Int. Futurity Winners came from this litter. He was a great hound on Hare, but a wee bit close at the check to win at the Hare trials. When he was past 12 years old, and paralyzed in the rear legs, he dragged his rear to the field and tongued on a line with other beagles hunting with Haskel Barker and Bill Allen.

A hound named Echo Valley Buddy was sired by Gay Flag. Buddy won a first in the field and two in shows in the same year. He was a great hound but was lost or stolen on a hunt, so he only bred a few bitches. Gay Flag has several descendants that are living yet today, and he has as Reese predicted, influenced hunting hounds in a positive way a great deal. In Flag's stud ad in December of 1980, Frank Reese described him as: "A hard driving, fast hunter, lightening quick at the check, quiet in the kennel, no shyness, with the disposition of a house pet. We do not think any hound can run all the line and hold at the check and beat him".

With all of this ability in Baker and Flag I asked Reese why these hounds were not field champions themselves. He replied that he didn't have any aspirations to own a field champion, that he just bred hounds for his own pleasure, for private hunts, and an occasional field trial to test their merits against other hounds. In fact, he said that he really didn't want to own a field champion. When I asked

why, he replied that it was because of his health and he cannot take the weather and long hours. Also that it was too risky to run a field champion among deer and along highways as he has always done. Frank said it takes more than a title for me to use a sire. A title means very little to me now. I never print the CBS title or whatever it is (CHB, for Certified Hunting Beagle) in pedigrees. A brace winner means a lot to me. I know I don't want any of them.

Gay Charm, sister to Gay Fury bred to Pointline Buddy was not a good cross but some from the cross produced real well. When Charm was bred to High Rock Ranger, it produced some of the greatest ever produced in North Carolina. The Sam Deal hounds all came through Charm. "Gay Charm, Cindy, and Black (High Rock Ranger x Gay Charm) made up the best trio I ever saw run...

Now I will give you some records, both Gay Baker and Gay Dash have sired field champions on Large Pack on Hare and Small Pack on Cottontail. You could write a book about the wins of their grand-pups. Gay Flag and his brother Glynn's Gay Demon, full brothers, have sired field champions on the same bitch: Fd. Ch. Cane Country Jenny (she by Dingus MacRae). Here you have two from the same cross both great producers which is very rare in both dogs and other animals.

Another male which resulted from one of the Gay Baker x Gay Cindy matings is a hound named Fd. Ch. Glynn's Gay Demon. Demon has produced quite a few hounds of note: many of them in the Deep South. At least one of Demon's sons, Fd. Ch. Ben's Creek Happy Boy and one daughter (T- BABE) are field champions, and there are probably more that I don't know about.

Frank Reese was asked to comment on the Gay hounds of today, but he said that he would not do that. He said: "I am willing to pay for any advertising on my own hounds, but I am not willing to give free advertising to the dog traders." He went on to add that, "When a breeder develops a strain, I do not think anyone has ever taken over and bred them like the original breeder. Most times the strain goes out with the breeder. I think this is mostly because the new breeder does not know the weak spots." Frank Reese also said: "I saw most of the good ones in 1945 at the trials and I trained for leading kennels. I have before me pedigrees of all the great show and field winners up to 1960.

I breed from the pedigree. And one good one in a family means little to me. A Baker bitch, Dream Girl was down with 57 at Upper Hudson on Hare and she dominated the runs all day winning first. I had told Pearl Baker that she was the best bitch alive. She took her picture before they ran. Second was Int. Ch. Hunters Little Annie, mate to Dingus MacRae. To get her Int. Ch. points she had to take second to Dream Girl. Third was Fd. Ch. DFJ Melody (by Murphy White). Fourth place Fd. Ch. Green Mtn. Lassie (Champlain Bucky) and fourth Fd. Ch. Cane Country Jenny (Fd. Ch. Dingus MacRae). in Deep SouthShe was at my kennel twice to be bred to Flag and at one time I ran her five weeks and I never found a fault. All were field champions and from different states and by different sires. The judges said she won it right down the middle.

I'll save some more for another time-



# AKC CODE OF SPORTSMANSHIP

This month I thought I would write about the AKC Code of Sportsmanship in our Beagle Field Trial Rules. It is sad to see some areas losing ground in regard to holding field trials and losing our code of sportsmanship or maybe don't even know about it. On the back inside cover of our book, Beagle Field Trial Rules, there is the AKC Code of Sportsmanship, and the following bullet points are as printed.

PREFACE: The sport of purebred dog competitive events dates prior to 1884, the year of AKC's birth. Shared values of those involved in the sport include principles of sportsmanship. They are practiced in all sectors of our sport: Conformation, performance, companion, ship, and all facets of our sport would definitely benefit if we all participated and followed at our trials. Many believe that these principles of sportsmanship are the prime reason why our sport has thrived for over one hundred years. With the belief that it is useful to articulate the fundamentals of our sport periodically, this code is presented.

• Sportsmen respect the history, traditions, and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.

- Sportsmen commit to values of fair play, honesty, courtesy, and vigorous competition, as well as winning and losing gracefully.
- Sportsmen refuse to compromise their commitment and obligation to the sport of purebred dogs by injecting personal advantage or consideration into their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsman judge judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsman judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsman exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsman exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- The sportsman respects the AKC bylaws, rules, regulations, and policies governing the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen find that vigorous competition and civility are

not inconsistent and are able to appreciate the merit of their competition and the effort of competitors.

- Sportsmen welcome, encourage and support newcomers to the sport.
- Sportsmen will deal fairly with all those who trade with them.
- Sportsmen are willing to share honest and open appraisals of their breeding stock's strengths and weaknesses.
- Sportsmen spurn any opportunity to take personal advantage of positions offered or bestowed upon them.
- Sportsmen always consider as paramount the welfare of their dogs.
- Sportsmen refuse to embarrass the sport, the American Kennel Club, or themselves while taking part in the sport.

As I never really read the above until this year, I thought others might find it a point of interest and food for thought.



A quick reminder to all, legal dog training for the big hounds starts July 1st and the smaller hounds training season starts August 15th. Remember, training hounds in the field by NYS DEC definition is considered a form of hunting. Thus anyone engaged in such activity must possess a valid NYS Hunting License.

Also if you are running your dog(s) in the warmer weather don't forget to take all precautions for yourself and the dogs against ticks and other harmful insects. As many will attest to Ticks are a problem year round. But from what I've experienced they are most active in the upstate NY region during the hot summer months. As I've mentioned before, I had a neighbor that contracted Lyme Disease from ticks. He was

an extremely sick guy, so sick that his wife was worried if he'd make it. So trust me, take all precautions you don't want to get sick.

Remember, summer is an excellent time to be putting some effort into obtaining new and renewing landowner hunting permissions. As I've pointed out in the past one of the biggest problems we as an organization have had to deal with is hunting dogs on lands where they are not welcome. Thus, It's very important that we do our best to obtain hunting permission because the last thing we want to have to deal with as an organization is legislation that would restrict hunting with dogs in NYS.

In our state as well as others hunters having access to lands to hunt on has become in many areas very difficult. So, the earlier in the year we put time into developing landowners' permissions may pay off when we get to the actual start of hunting season. I've had DEC ENCON officers tell me they like to see written landowner hunting permission slips. I know that many landowners are reluctant to

provide such. So the best advice I go by is just do the best you can do and hopefully it all works out. And we all now need to keep in mind that under NYS law if you're caught on lands that one has no permission to be on with a firearm in hand it could lead to a felony arrest. And for sure a felony arrest is not good. Any comments about any of this please just call me.

A big thanks goes out to everyone that attended the banquet. All reports indicate our organization had an excellent day. Reminder yearly dues were due April 1st. Also, Amy can use any hunting information including pictures for posting at our Facebook page.
