Every May, right around the time the grass is greening up and the mornings are just right for a good rabbit race, we take a moment to recognize some of the most important people in our lives our mothers. This past Mother's Day, I had the opportunity to preach a sermon that stirred something deeper in me than usual. And as I looked around at the folks in the congregation people who've run dogs, raised kids, and walked through seasons of life with grit and grace - I realized just how closely our love for our hounds reflects something sacred.

You see, I run beagles. We chase rabbits through briars and thickets where only a good hound and a willing heart will go. There's something beautiful about watching a pack of beagles open on a fresh track, driving with purpose and music in their voices. That kind of teamwork doesn't happen by accident. It takes time, care, correction, and consistency.

You've got to know your dogs — their strengths, their quirks, and even the subtle signs when something's not right.

I also coon hunt, so I know what it means to pour into a dog for the long haul — late nights, long walks, and trusting your dog to do what it

was bred and trained to do. We don't just own these hounds — we invest in them. We raise them with the intention of bringing out their best, and when we cast them out into the dark, a part of us runs right along with them.

And that got me thinking — that's exactly what mothers do.

Proverbs 4:23 (ESV) says, "Keep your heart with all vigilance, for from it flow the springs of life." That verse isn't just about being careful — it's about being intentional. It's about guarding what matters most. And if there's anyone who models that kind of care, it's a mother.

Mothers don't just feed and clothe us — they watch us. They know when something's off, often before we do. They correct us when we stray, not to be mean, but because they see what we can become. They put in the hours, the worry, the prayers, and the sleepless nights. And they do it all out of love.

So, to my fellow Beaglers — and to those who coon hunt, bird hunt, or just love a good dog — take this to heart. Be the kind of person who watches closely, who cares deeply, and who invests with purpose. Let the way you handle your hounds reflect how you handle the things that really

matter — your faith, your family, your community.

After all, we're more than just hunters. We're stewards. We're guardians. And like our mothers before us. been we've entrusted with something worth protecting



VINTAGE FLASHBACK - A WILLET RANDALL LETTER

January 1917, Hounds and Hunting Magazine.

One of the first lesson I was taught was to be truthful. How well I have followed the teaching I wouldn't dare to say here, but to say the truth in this case, it was 9 o'clock this morning when I woke up, and I guess I would have been sleeping yet if the wind hadn't almost blown me out of bed-Gee! But this is some weather up in the woods-that bunch of Northern Hare fellows made good their escape just in time, for the next day after the races closed the thermometer went to 10 below zero, the snow came down in torrents, and we had a regular old fashioned Adirondack blizzard, and by the looks out side tonight it isn't over yet.

I know he always sat with a long face, and looked out of the hotel window, and every now and then drew a sigh.

I heard it rumored this morning that it wasn't "corn" that kept him awake, but I wouldn't dare tell you any more, least it should reach his ears.

I was in the hotel yesterday; it's pretty lonesome. All those big chairs in the office were as empty as a dog house on Trial day.

The proprietor was in the cellar, and I waited till he came up. "What you been doin'? George, down there?"

"Oh! Fixin' up some more hair tonic for the Northern Hare bunch next year, and trying to get the 'dents' out of that pinch bottle," he replied.

Just then Si Perkins' boy came in. He asked George how the dents came to be in that bottle, and George explained it to him in a very satisfactory way, while Si's boy stood by with half-open mug.

After George had finished, Si's boy stretched himself and said, "and they'll drew it every time."

Just then I started for the door, and as I opened it, in walked Bob Higgins. When he saw Si's boy, he busted out laughin; and almost threw a fit. Bob asked Si's boy if he had lost his dog? "No, I ain't, and we got sothin' else to do besides chase houn's like some of the rest of yer North Creekers has been doing for the last three weeks.

No, we ain't got no dog, but we got some fine yerlin's and one of 'em got out this mornin' and run up this way – jumped the fence and run into Straight's back yard. I'm lookin' fer 'er."

"Well," said Bob, "if I see her, I'll let you know. Isn't that unusual for them to do this?"

"No," said Si's boy, "they'll draw it every time."

Bob grinned again. I saw the situation was growing serious, so I made an excuse that it was almost dinner time, and I must go up to the kennels.

As I closed the door I heard Bob ask Si's boy "who that feller was sittin' on the cracker box in Wade's grocery the other night."

I heard Si's boy say his name was Biddell, and that was all I could stand, so I shut the hotel door with a slam and beat it.

Well, boys, the Northern Hare Trials are over. To say I enjoyed it would be putting it mild. There will, no doubt, be a full account of it in this issue, so I will leave this part for those who were detailed to write it up.

I believe the secretary, Mr. Rowe, did ask me to write up the banquet, but as I was absent directly after supper, I could not in justice tell you all that happened.

It seems that both Bob Higgins and Mr. Zmmer suddenly disappeared, leaving no possible clue as to their where-a-bouts, and as I was somewhat familiar with the town, I was asked to try and locate them.

I went around to several places where I thought them most likely to be found, but no trace could I find, until at a late hour I made the discovery-they were over to Si Perkins.'

When I got over there Si's boy weas out milking and both Bob and Zim were waiting for him to come in, so I felt it would be wrong to give them away and spoil their good time, so I just went back to the hotel and kept "mum." Still I couldn't help but envy them.

It was just luck on our part that either Mr. and Mrs. Butz, or myself were able to get to the banquet at all.

There had been about eight inches of snow the night before, and we

had 12 miles to go through the drifts from Beaver Meadow Farm to the Village.

Mr. Butz drove a Studebaker "six." He always had all confidence in his car, and thought he could climb Pikes Peak, or go over the Rockies in it, but I am sure these Odirondack Hills got his goat more than he would dare to tell you.

Several times we were stuck in the snow banks, and had to get out and shovel in order to get a new start.

We found, to our sorrow, that we didn't have a chain, and even the gas was getting low.

I went back to the stable and got a big log chain, and Ralph fastened it on, and we proceeded. All went well until we got to the big hills, and then the fun began-the car skidded, and slid all the way down, while I hung on for dear life, and didn't dare to look around to see if Mrs. B. was still coming.

However, Providence for once favored us, and we made the trip without a scratch. When we finally got there Ralph said we ought to be thankful for being here alive, and I agreed with him to the extent that we at once found the proprietor of the hotel, and ordered six cans of "hair tonic' which disappeared in the same ridiculous fashion that Bob and Zim did.

Mr. and Mrs. Butz were with me here at the farm for five weeks before the Trials, and we surely did have some fun with the Beagles while they were here. Mr. Butz brought along nine of his good dogs, and I had 34, so between us we could pick a fresh brace for every hunt, and believe me we did have some royal chases.

We usually ran the dogs in braces, but sometimes took out the whole pack. Often we took 5 or 6, which ran well together, and they made the big white hare go some.

We could have killed our full quota, but would rather see the working of the dogs and hear the music than to butcher the innocents. Ralph took home with him a few of those which had turned almost pure white, just to show the boys down there what these hare look like, as they don't have the hare in that section of the country.

After the snow came we had many chances to learn what strange dogs would do on snow, and as I have always advocated better hunting on snow than bare ground, we had many opportunities to try it out.

Some of the Bruno dogs had never seen snow, and when we took them out they were entirely lost, and did not know what to make of it

Mr. Butz had one dog from Texas-a fine little "Tippieannoe." He had never been North before and the first time he was put down was when the judge ordered the dogs put down for the Championship race.

Of course, this was not a fair chance for the dog, and it was not strange that he refused to hunt well, although the next time we had him afield he did as fine work as any Beagle I ever saw, and it was a pretty sight to see him retrieve a big white hare.



SEEDS AND GRAINS MAKE SENSE FOR RABBITS

The month is June. With lots of rain this year, the food strips are lush with good grass and clover. In the late afternoon, we count dozens and dozens of rabbits, of all sizes, out grazing on the paths. With all of this good feed available, what more could be done?

I keep my feeders filled all year round, usually with oats. Pellets are well-formulated with a balanced ration, but I find they get stale or moldy, or rabbits sit in the feed pan and urinate over it, creating a lot of waste. The feeders are emptied more frequently and thoroughly this time of year than at any other time except late winter when the breeding season starts or when there is snow on the ground.

Oats are not the only grain available through the summer. Plantings of winter wheat or rye are ripening. The rabbits gnaw off the seed stalk and pull it down to their level, then eat the grain. They also enjoyed the foliage from last fall through early summer. Surprisingly, I've watched the same behavior with seed heads from different grasses. instance, blocks of orchard grass are covered with their distinctive cock-spur seed heads in June. The rabbits pull these seed heads down and eat the seeds. Researchers studying the distribution of various smartweeds (a peppery broadleaf weed with small pink and white flowers) attributed the spread of this weed to rabbits that relish the tiny seeds and pass

about 60% of them undigested and viable in their feces.

Seeds, particularly grains, are packed with all of the nutrients a young plant needs to get started until its own leaves and roots can generate and absorb whatever the plant needs. In terms of dietary needs for rabbits, grains are packed with oils, essential amino acids, and minerals that support growth and reproduction. A grass and forb diet may not provide those things in necessary amounts, and reproduction may suffer. Consider, too, that when we run rabbits for an hour or so, the rabbit is using precious calories and metabolites that may be difficult to replace without an energy and protein-packed diet that includes seeds and grains.



Despite June's tender growth, rabbits clean out this one gallon pan of oats in less than a week.



Winter rye provides green forage through the winter, and excellent cover and feed into mid-summer. In Pennsylvania, rye and other winter grains are planted from September into November.

Our goals for this time of year include getting our rabbits in shape to survive the coming winter and perhaps squeezing those last few litters out of our rabbit population through July and August. A study comparing controlled-burned and unburned areas discovered that essential sulfur-based amino acids are not present in vegetation in sufficient concentrations to support rabbits. This may be one reason we see reproduction drop off in mid to late summer. Supplemental feeding of grains can help offset this deficiency.

Potential winter grain plots can be cleared in July and August. In Pennsylvania, we plant our winter grains such as rye, wheat, barley, and triticale in September and October. Oats can be planted nearly any time, though they do best in the spring with cooler temperatures and plenty of rain. Oats will freeze out when the daily average temperatures drop to 39 degrees. I like to use oats as a nurse crop for other plantings such as lespedeza, switchgrass, and clovers. They make a good feed strip on their own. A high nitrogen fertilizer and often a bit of lime make a great deal of difference in growth and grain production.




A winter wheat planting in late June. Rabbits and deer have mowed all of the ripe grain off in a matter of days.



THE VALUE OF A GOOD HOUND

It was one of those evenings you don't forget. Spring is working its way into summer, the sun turning the sky a bright orange and pink, and the air is settled, soft around 65. The kind of day you wish you could capture in a picture, but know you never will. That's when I took her out of the kennel for the last time.

She wasn't the first good one I'd owned, but she was the first great one. Truly great. We had twelve seasons together, and they passed in the blink of an eye. In her prime, she was as fine a rabbit dog as I've ever laid eyes on. And more than that, she was a companion. The kind that makes life better.

She stood about thirteen and a half inches at the shoulder. Compact

and put together right. And what a head! The kind you don't see too often on a bitch—houndy in the best way. Legs straight, markings clean: black, tan, and white all in balance like a painting. And that voice... son, that voice could light up a river bottom. A deep, clear bawl mouth that carried through the woods like church bells on a Sunday morning.



What a standard she set for my little kennel. What a great measuring stick she made, by which all other hounds were—and are—measured. Fair or not, every hound since has lived in her shadow.

To top it all off, she could produce. She produced several really nice offspring—some very nearly as good as herself. Some of them are as dear to my memory as she is. But that's a different story.

There had, of course, been plenty of ribbons along the way—even a few blue ones. Not that that matters much now. But it's hard to deny the thrill of winning when you're young and full of spunk. At the time, people at the trials seemed to know who she was, even if they didn't know me!



Because of her, I got invited to hunts I wouldn't have otherwise sniffed. Made friends I wouldn't have known and got to see a new country. I wore out boots and truck tires. But I'd trade both again tomorrow for one more like her. I wonder now how many hours we spent together in the woods. How many miles did we cover? What a joy it was to watch her work.

But now the years and miles had taken their toll. She could no longer keep up or keep the weight on. Thin and getting weaker, it was time. And so I took her out of her kennel for the last time, snapped a leash on her, and walked her to the edge of the field. As I cut her loose for one last walk, one last conversation, she seemed to know it was the end. Maybe I was hoping for a miracle. Maybe I'd hear that voice one last time. Maybe I thought she would show me that it wasn't the end after all.

As I reached down to unsnap the leash, her once-bright tan head—now grizzled and gray—told a truth I didn't want to hear. She sniffed around on the paths and even tried to duck into the briars. The "want to" was still there. All heart, but physically unable to go.

Her voice has been silent now for many years. As I think of her, I wonder: What is the value of a good hound? It certainly can't be measured in dollars. It's not ribbons and titles. Is it the sheer pleasure of having owned such a hound? Or the joy of watching greatness in action?

Maybe the value of a good hound lies in all the lessons they teach you. I suppose I've learned more about rabbit hunting and hounds from her than any human has ever taught me. Ruark said, "If a man is really intelligent, there's practically nothing a good dog can't teach him." I believe that.

I guess the value of a good hound is some combination of all these things. But as I sit here in my chair, I can't help but think that the real value of such a hound is all the memories. That's where the great ones live after they're gone. It's the chance to go back in time. The chance to relive some great hunts. It's the friends and the memory of friends that are no longer with us. It's the chance to see again in my mind's eye the little tri-colored hound with the big voice, leading the pack round and round through the briar patches.

I'm sure the value of a good hound can be measured in the dreams and memories that live on in our minds. Even now, the memories of some great hunts come flooding back into my mind. I can see old friends gathered around the tailgate, I can hear them telling jokes and laughing. I can smell the packed lunch on a cold winter's day. They're all there. We're all there together again. And if I try hard enough, I can almost hear that little tri-colored hound with the bawl mouth running in the distant piney woods. Calling the pack to her. Telling the story one more time.

Hurry up, boys, grab your shells—she's got him going!

Yes, sir. That's the value of a good hound.

Jumbo is one of the baddest big males to run a rabbit since beagles learned they could run rabbits. I remember the first time I watched Jumbo run out in the wild in Kansas a couple years ago and could not believe a dog could flow those long of stretches on a pack of dogs and make it look so easy. He hunts like he knows where every rabbit is hiding in the field and after he jumps it, that rabbit better run and hide. He has a great head down chop mouth and is wicked smart when he is running. His check system is so efficient and clean that he rarely has a check that lasts over a couple seconds before he is driving away from other dogs. He finished faster than any other dog that I have handled before in 8 trials with 3 wins, 3 2nds, 1 3rd, and measured out one time. He was a strong competitor in both GDB and SPO trials. He gained wins in IL, WI, and VA in classes of 21, 34, and 42 respectively.

He is a very easy keeper in the kennel and never barks, but once the tailgate drops he knows it is game-time. Jumbo has already produced a NSPC FCGD in very limited breedings.



FCGD JJ's LOW COUNTRY ZEB is a big dog in a small sporty frame. He won and placed in 13" and 15" true borderline dog, standing between 12 3/4" and 13 3/4". He runs with power and works a check inside out. He always returns to the point of loss when working the check. He is a rabbit-hunting machine that jumps more than his fair share of rabbits. He is fast as \$&@ "out of a check. Handles like a dream, is quiet in the kennel, and listens well. Brains, Hunt, Explosive Drive is the best way to describe Zeb.

LADIES NEW TO RABBIT HUNTING ON THE LAST DAY OF THE SEASON

A MEMORABLE EXPERIENCE

The Maryland rabbit hunting season was ending on February 28, as it is in many states. My friend D.J. and I had discussed how we wanted to end this season with a bang by hunting on a hot spot. I asked our friends and frequent hunting partners, Eddie Morris and Dan Jewell, if we could get together for a hunt on the last day. They have access to a nice piece of property that has housed numerous rabbits for the last few years. They needed to consider work obligations and the weather before committing themselves to this hunt. They are watermen and are harvesting oysters during the winter months. The previous week's weather had been terrible with high winds and to catch up with their harvests. but Eddie called me on Thursday, were not harvesting oysters on the 28th and were ready for a hunt. Eddie stated that he and Dan had invited three ladies to join us for their first rabbit hunt. I welcomed their invitation to these ladies.

freezing weather, which prevented them from working. They needed I was prepared to make other arrangements for the last day hunt, February 2,7, stating that they

We do not get many ladies or youngsters in the field with us.

Eddie said to meet them at 9:30 AM on the property.

D.J. and I met them right at 9:30 AM as Dan, Eddie, Paige Evans, her husband, and another friend were waiting. Paige was so excited about participating in this hunt that she hurried out of the house and forgot her boots. Eddie said Taylor Robinson and Allie Poe would be right back as they went to get a pair of boots for Paige. Within minutes, Allie and Taylor returned with a pair of boots for Paige. We exchanged pleasantries, and I gave them my usual safety talk. They were excited and ready to do some rabbit hunting. We positioned them with Dan and Eddie so they could keep them informed of how the hunt was proceeding and keep them in safe positions so they would see rabbits. D.J. was covering the rear in case rabbits tried to sneak by. They all got ahead of me and the dogs as I started the dogs at the far end of the covers and would push towards them. Paige's husband and her friend did not participate in the hunt. We were running my six pack of Beagles, Sammie, Shorty, Hobo, Peewee, Jim, and Ransom.

I waited until the hunters were in place and turned my pack loose. This area of covers is covered with thick grass, briars, small trees, a small pond situated in the middle, a ditch filled with water, and a couple of small gulleys surrounding this area. We have hunted here before,

and when these rabbits get up, they run in all directions, and multiple rabbits get up as the dogs are working these covers. Today was no exception, with the dogs getting on a fastmoving rabbit within minutes, and the chase was on. I yelled rabbit up to our hunters. After a short chase. circular

multiple shots rang out. In a few minutes, more shots rang out, and Eddie and Paige had their first two rabbits in the bag. I usually can remember who killed what rabbit and how many shots, but the way this land is laid out and the positions of our hunters, it would be impossible to keep track of all the activities, so I will describe this hunt as best I can and give credit to all.

I was working the dogs as usual, which requires me to go into the cover in the way I prefer to hunt. Sammie got on a side rabbit and gave chase with the other dogs, quickly joining in. This rabbit surprised me by making a quick dash behind me. I made one shot for a miss but yelled to D.J., who was watching the rear. He made a long shot for a miss, and the dogs were in hot pursuit. They ran this rabbit to the far end of the cover where no hunters were standing, so I called them off, and we continued hunting the heavy covers. Within a brief time, the dogs had rabbits up and running. Multiple rabbits were running

in all directions. Dan and Taylor made a few shots and had one or two. I saw Allie standing near me on the outside of the cover,s and I told her any spot you stand is good because these rabbits are now spooked up and are running in all directions, so watch out. Shortly thereafter, she told me that she saw a rabbit stop in some briars near her. I told her to get ready, as I would kick those briars to get this rabbit to move. This rabbit ran past her as I walked around, and she made one shot, but did not know if she hit it. I told her to stand still and let me look for it, as many rabbits will not run far if they are not being chased by the dogs. I located her downed rabbit nearby and yelled, "dead rabbit!" As I bent over to retrieve it, she saw another rabbit speed away, but she could not shoot for safety. The dogs were running and barking hot and heavy opposite of us, so I told her to follow me through the cover so we could go near the other hunters and get into the hot action. There were multiple shots

by the other five hunters, with hits and misses. As we were making our way through the cover, the dogs ran a rabbit near me, and I put it down with two shots. I saw other rabbits running all around me, but I did not shoot for safety. I wanted our guests to get in as much safe shooting as possible.

Allie and I finally got through these heavy covers and were now standing in a clearing between two areas of covers along with the other hunters. We repositioned ourselves and could see rabbits as they bounced in and out of the covers. Paige said she and Eddie had five rabbits in their vests. I asked the ladies if they were having fun, and all gave a resounding yes with big smiles on their faces. My pack of dogs were working one scent line after another and packing together like champions pushing rabbits near and far from the hunters. I told Eddie to let us work some low covers this way the ladies can see the rabbits running in open spaces and when they pop out. As I walked in these low covers with the dogs a rabbit got up near me, but I did not shoot because again I wanted our lady guests to shoot. Now rabbits were back up running everywhere. I had positioned the ladies in an area outside of the covers where I knew the rabbits would run. Within a brief time one rabbit ran


straight back at Paige or Allie and with one shot as it cleared, a safe shot was made with her cutting its head off with one shot. We veteran hunters all gave them high fives and congratulations on their shooting skills and kills. A brief time after this kill, two rabbits ran out of the covers side by side but a bit separate from each other with Allie and Paige each making one shot apiece simultaneous hitting both rabbits. It was this time that a movie camera would have been great to capture this moment, but I saw it. I walked over and asked them if they had been rabbit hunting before and were not being honest with us. They both said" no." I told them they have experience in rabbit hunting because they were doing too good for first timers. They did admit that they have shot sporting

clays. We laughed and continued hunting because the dogs had left this section of covers and gone to the third section and were running at least two separate rabbits, but numerous side rabbits had run in our direction. Dan, D.J. and I were spread out in a distance from the covers that the dogs were burning up a number of scent lines. We popped at least five rabbits that ran near us, but a couple more got past us.

The dogs got back together on one scent and ran it back to the original area where we started. We repositioned ourselves again. Eddie had the hot trigger finger now as he got 2-3 rabbits near the end of this heavy cover. One rabbit kept running back and forth on a nearby ditch but would not show itself. I walked over and caught a glimpse of it dashing away but not

enough for a shot. It ran down to the narrow part of the ditch and was returning back to the second area of covers when it ran past Allie who missed and I along with Paige made two long shots for misses. This one was left to breed for next year. The dogs ran another rabbit across the opening, but it saw D.J. and stopped amidst some covers. D.J. waited for the dogs to push it out but as it came near him, he stung it, and this rabbit found safety in a ground hog hole.

It was getting time to quit as we did not know how many rabbits were harvested but we knew it was a lot. We gathered near Eddie's four-wheeler to put the rabbits in the basket when suddenly a rabbit that had been sitting about ten feet from us and the dogs dashed away across the open field. The dogs all





eye balled it and gave chase while screaming away. All guns had been unloaded at this time, and we laughed and could not believe that this rabbit was so close to us with no one or the dogs seeing it. Talk about great rabbit camouflage. This rabbit ran down the middle ditch with the dogs in hot pursuit. Taylor and I walked over to cover the ditch in case it returned and D.J. went to the end of this ditch in case it tried to cross at that point. This rabbit had other ideas to live a bit longer and ran into a faraway area of covers that we did not hunt. I called the dogs off this rabbit and as they came near me and D.J. and we leashed them up. We did not receive any objections from them because they were tired and had given outstanding performances.

We walked to the trucks which were parked about one hundred yards away to count our kills, take pictures, share stories and the joys of this hunt. We killed our limit and left plenty to breed for next season. Six rabbits got away from us with three running in faraway covers and two that ran in the yard of a nearby house. None of these did we pursue, plus the one that found safety in a groundhog hole.

I do not know what words to use to describe this hunt. Should I use "impressive, awesome, sweet, great, magnificent, dream hunt or memorable." All these words fit and describe this hunt for us. It will be most memorable for the ladies because this was their first rabbit hunt. This hunt was successful in the fun we had; the harvest was great, and safety was prime. The ladies expressed their immense pleasure in participating

in this hunt and stated that it was not what they expected. Allie and Taylor said it sure beats deer hunting. Taylor said she may have access to some land for us to use next season for rabbit hunting. This is great whenever we get invited to hunt on new lands. I told our new hunters that there are no scared shells when hunting with me so take long shots if necessary, but go check the area where you shot for a downed rabbit. Today, there were no scared shells with this hunting party as many of us had few shells remaining in our jackets and some only those in our guns. What a memorable day! We plan to hunt again next season on this same area of land.

The best part of this hunt was inviting these ladies to participate and the fun they had.

AKC NBC Hunting Performance Test - NEWS & UPDATES

For those who haven't read one of our articles, the AKC NBC Hunting Performance Test for beagles is a 3-level Hunting Performance Test focused on evaluating individual dogs on their natural abilities in the field. The first level is recognized by the National Beagle Club & the 2nd and 3rd levels are AKC titles. This test is comparable to hunting evaluations for bird dogs, bassets, and PBGVs. It is non-competitive and designed to evaluate stock that may have never been tried in the field, as well as bringing new people into the sport of hunting over their hounds. Because of this test, we have gathered interest from tons of people throughout the United States who may have never seen a beagle chase a rabbit. This article is a catch-up from the last few tests and to announce some

upcoming ideas within the program!

We have had 4 AKC **NBC** Hunting Performance Tests since September of 2024. In that time, we have had a total of 288 individual

runs at the four different tests. We have achieved 72 new Hunting Beagle Instinct titles (HBI), 22 new Hunting Beagle Novice titles (HBN), and 18 new Hunting Beagle Advanced titles (HBA). These tests were held in Pennsylvania, Virginia, & Tennessee. In August, we head to lowa for the first time for a 3-day Hunting Performance Test.

For those interested in holding a test, we have information and help available on how to host your own AKC NBC HPT.

Almost every judge we have approved evaluate dogs through this program has mentioned how enjoyable it is to see green hounds and



the sport. These new people learn to fall in love with watching their hounds run. Bringing new people into your club can also help boost revenue, as well as bring in new blood to work parties. This event can also be a good source of income. To give you a glance at a few of the test's finances. I'm the Vice President of the Beechton Beagle Club. We have held 2 tests worth of Hunting Performance Tests since Sept 2024. In those 2 tests, with minimal work, we have brought in a profit of \$1,495.77. Our first test made over \$900 on its own in 1 day. For my club, we have a lot of people in central PA who are looking for test sites, so holding at least 1 day a year is very profitable for our club. Depending on your location & time of year, you may have untapped potential for bringing in an excited new crowd to beagling and the ability to make some extra cash. If you would ever like to chat about holding a test, I'm happy to help organize one at your club.

I'd also like to recognize a few very special beagles in this write-up. We have had numerous dogs achieve their Hunting Beagle Advanced title over the past few years of holding these tests and a decent number of Hunting Beagle Novice titles. These dogs have been from field households

OR from people who were involved in writing this test. For example, I have multiple fields x that show crosses that have achieved various levels of this test. I also have a FULL show beagle that I did not breed that achieved her Hunting Beagle Novice. Her name is Stonemeadow's Much To My Surprise At Sugar Hill HBN out of Mary Cummings' beautiful breeding program. I have also had a Champion show dog get to HBN & another to HBA. Other owners, such as the cocreator of this test. Khalida Hendricks. have achieved HBAs with her GCHB show girl- the only GCHB to date with an HBA title. For those of you who don't know, CH and GCH are high show titles for conformation. The few dualpurpose breeders out there have various show x field crosses that have achieved different levels of this test. Needless to say, not many people outside of the field community have achieved a Qualifying run in Novice with their dog, let alone the Novice title. There are a few dogs out there with 1 qualifying run in Novice, but after these 4 tests, I can say there are at least 2 show dogs that have received



Novice titles that came into this test with very little to NO experience. hunting Their owners have shown up for multiple events and worked with these dogs. The best part of creating this test TO DATE is watching these 2 dogs start on rabbits and improve to the level of Hunting Beagle Novice hounds. I'd like to personally congratulate Edith Markoff with Joey & Stephanie Peebles with Peter Pan on achieving this

title. We hope to continue to see more hounds work towards getting their Novice titles and are excited to bring new people into the sport.

is also definitely worth mentioning that at the 2024 Hunting Performance Test that was held in conjunction with the Beagle National Specialty, we #1 had the show beagle in the country

at the time run in our test. Gemma not only ran but also passed her Hunting Beagle Instinct title after sight chasing a rabbit. To have one of the top beagles attend, let alone achieve her title, was amazing to be a part of. Gemma is owned by Jen Baker and handled

Laura Chamness. Gemma's full name is Multiple Group Winning RBIS MBISS **GCHP** South's Southern Nights TKN FDC ATT HBI. We are thankful that her handler and owner trusted our test & cared enough about the functionality of the breed to see if one of the most structurally correct beagles in the country had some Instinct! I'd love to see more top dogs evaluated in the dog show world! This



is how we truly preserve form and function. Thank you to those who have had their dogs evaluated.

The future of this test is very bright. After a few years of running these tests and troubleshooting, Khalida Hendricks and I have decided to submit to the AKC for a few additions to our titling process. To date, these are not accepted and are just ideas. Our 3-level test has proven challenging, as it should be. We are in the process of discussing the Hunting Beagle Foundation's title. If approved, this would be an alternative title between Hunting Beagle Instinct and Beagle Hunting Novice. Many of the beagles cast in a Hunting Beagle Instinct pack are being cut loose for the first time in their lives. If they show promise, they pass and are expected to run a partial line on a rabbit in the next level. This is a big jump between levels and can be discouraging. We think this alternative titling will help direct new owners towards proper training when starting their hound. Another titling proposal has been a Hunting Beagle Expert or Master's title. In different AKC sports, such as agility, a dog can run at the highest level multiple times. For those who enjoy the format but have achieved their Hunting Beagle Advanced title, there is nowhere left to go with their hound in this test. If approved, it has been discussed that after 10 passes of the Advanced level, you receive your Hunting Beagle Expert title. If you pass another 10 times, you will get an HBE2 title, and so This is not in effect at this time, but if you run your hounds the class and it passes at a later date, your hound WILL be eligible for this titling process. The names or exact qualifications for these potential titles are undecided and not approved at this time, but we are excited to announce the possibility

HARRY'S CAJUN COOKING CORNER

SHRIMP STEW

By: Harry Nolan

1 cup flour

July 19

August 23

3/4 cup oil for the roux

1 onion, chopped - shallots may

also be added

1 bell pepper, chopped

2 ribs celery, chopped

Cajun Seasonings or Season-All

1 lb shrimp, peeled and de-veined,

crawfish or both

1/2 to 1 cup chopped green onion

tops - scallions

1/2 to 1 cup parsley chopped

2 cups rice

6 boiled eggs (optional)

1/2 teaspoon white pepper

1/2 teaspoon black pepper

1/8 teaspoon celery seed

1 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon cayenne or to taste

In a Dutch oven pot combine oil and roux. Cook slowly over medium heat stirring continually for approximately 35 to 45 minutes until the roux is similar to a dark copper penny color. If using store purchased roux, use approximately three-quarters of the jar.


Once the copper color of the roux is achieved, add the onion, bell pepper and celery directly into the roux and cook down until veggies are soft. Start with two to three cups of water, add to the roux until the roux dissolves into a savory type gravy.

Mix well and let mixture come to a soft boil, then reduce heat, cooking for an additional 30 minutes or more if needed. At this time you can adjust the roux or liquid if you need extra. Add the liquid gradually to allow the gravy to have a consistency that will stick to the rice. In addition, add the salt, white and black pepper, cayenne to taste, celery seed to the mixture along with the boiled eggs if using.

Season the shrimp with your favorite Cajun seasoning Season All.

Add the seasoned shrimp, the parsley, and onion tops and cook until shrimp are pink; 10 minutes more. Taste and adjust seasonings.

Serve over hot rice.
